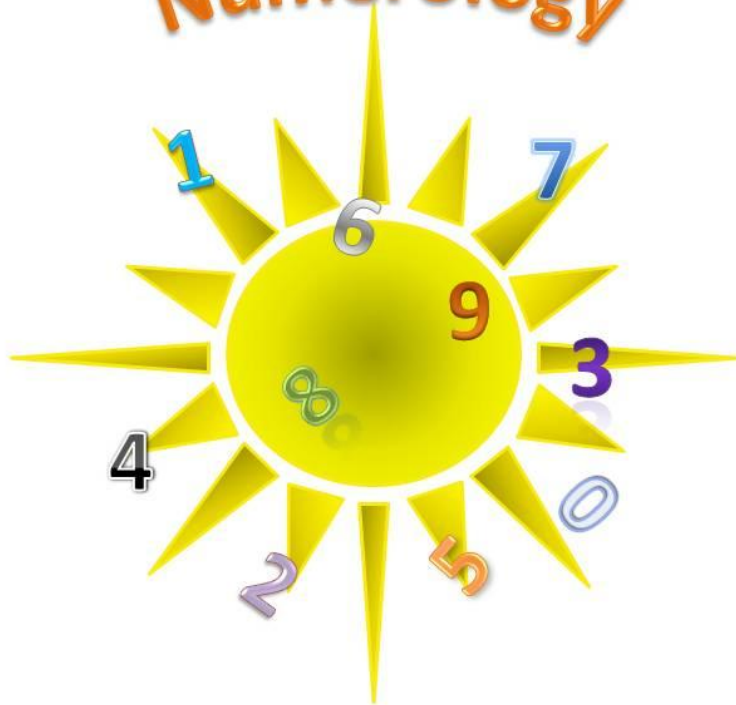

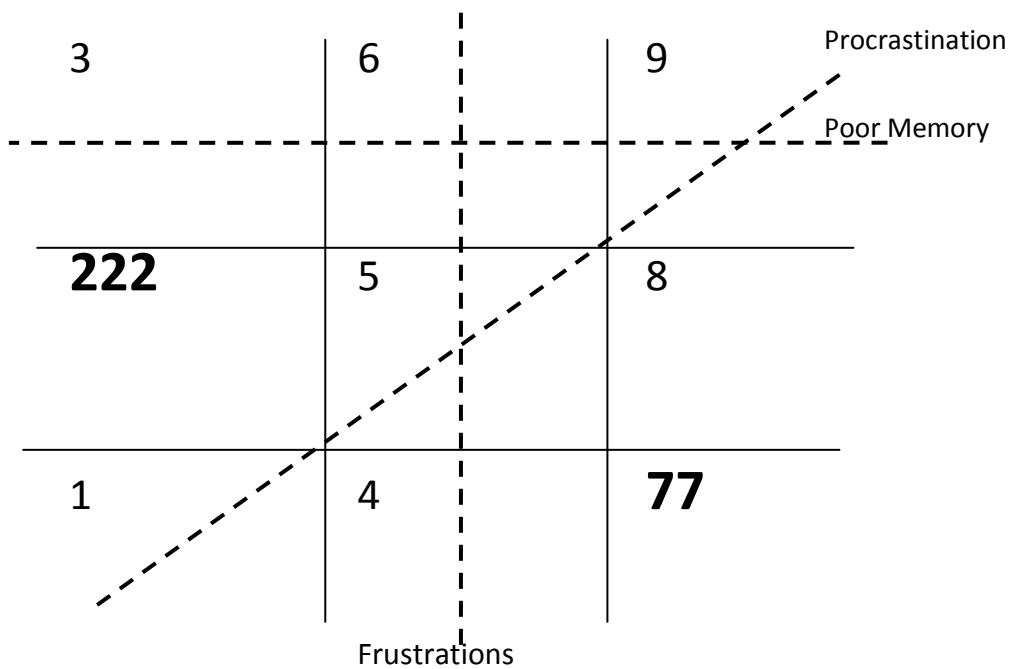

## **A Short Introduction to Numerology**

Since the beginning of time numbers, aside from their use as values and for measurements, have always had a mystical significance. The ancient Egyptians, Indians and Chaldeans were especially interested in the occult side of numbers and began practicing numerology. Observations of the night sky eventually led to the creation of the first calendar, which maintained parallels to Astrology. The earliest known system of numbers was developed over 10,000 years ago by the Mayas.

Numerology is an interpretation of numbers which gives information about disposition, character traits and a person's plans for the future. It is based on the principle of oscillations. The philosopher and mathematician, Pythagoras of Samos (6 B.C.), assumed that the numbers 1 through 9 represented a complete cycle of oscillation. This view was derived from the observation that every conceivable number was based on the numbers from 1 through 9, obtained by adding the digits, such as 12 which makes 3, or 34 which makes 7. At a later time the so called "Master numbers" of numerology were determined, 11 and 22. According to the analogy in which a reflection of the regularity of the cosmos is found on earth, these oscillations have an influence on people who were born on that specific day or who have a certain name. (In order to interpret names, the letters of the name are transformed into numbers from 1 to 9 according to an established formula). In this respect a logical numerical sequence is similar to light or to electric or magnetic fields. Here it is important to note that even nature itself is regulated by a system which creates geometry and includes complex patterns which are determined by numbers.

## **How to Read This Report**

This numerology report will present information that is both broad and very specific. The further through the report you read, the more specific the interpretation.

By definition, the initial birth chart interpretation (of the numbers in your dog's date of birth) are quite broad, and should be tempered by the more specific readings attached to such things as your dog's ruling number, combinations of your dog's birth date, your dog's number of fate, and so on.

It is therefore recommended that you read through the report in it's entirety, and then come back and review in more detail once that is complete.

Enjoy your report – your dog is one of a kind.

## The Birth Chart

In order to include every number in the birth date and interpret the lines which are created, all the numbers of the birth date are entered into a chart. For those who know more about Numerology, this chart represents an individual pattern which tells about strengths, weaknesses, orientation and capacity. Generally a dog's qualities are more balanced when there are more different numbers. Naturally there is no birth chart in which all the spaces are filled, on the other hand, up to seven spaces can be left empty (which is the case in this chart for Hamish McPup as he was born on 27/7/2002 – he only has 2's and 7's in his chart).

The birth diagram is made up of three levels: the lower (1, 4, 7) is the practical level, which stands for action, physical abilities, constitution and dealing with material things. In the middle of the chart there is a connection between both external levels which is the spiritual, intuitive or emotional level (2, 5, 8). Finally the consciousness and intellect are formed in the upper or mental level (3, 6, 9). This includes the imagination, thought, learning habits and intelligence, which includes the ability to analyse.

### No One in the Chart

One is the first number of the practical level and explains how we express ourselves to the outside world and how we can come into contact with it. Also the one stands for our initial reaction to external circumstances. It describes if we are too strict with ourselves and are inhibited.

No one in the chart usually points to a dog that doesn't like to be first to do something new. They are quite often happy to join in once someone else or some other pet has tested the water, so to speak.

### Three Twos in the Chart

Two is the first number on a spiritual level, the origin of intuition and feeling. It implies sensitivity and understanding for ourselves and our environment. In this century there won't be any birth date without at least one two.

Three two's implies a very sensitive dog. This dog may be so sensitive that it's lack of a protective coating against the outside world may be a problem. This can lead to frustration and confusion for your dog (who may feel that they are in trouble when your anger is actually directed elsewhere). Dogs with three or more 2's may seem to live in their own little world, oblivious to the outside world as a means of defence. These dogs need frequent shows of affection, guidance and love.

## **No Three in The Chart**

Three is the first number on the mental level, which gives it a special significance. The balance which develops between the numbers one and two is of such a quality that adding even a single three creates an ideal constellation.

Here we have a dog who may not stick at a task and gets impatient quickly, especially with training. Your dog may also show low levels of loyalty, confidence, and self-esteem. It can also refer to a non-demonstrative dog.

## **No Four in the Chart**

The Four symbolizes balance and control, like a square. It is both a practical and a material number. Because it is positioned at the centre of the practical level, dogs with a dominant four are usually very well behaved and even tempered. They can also be hard workers (such as working dogs, hounds, rescue dogs, etc).

Probably others accuse your dog of being lazy and sluggish. This dog is one that wants to see results quickly, and can therefore be hard to train. This dog does not live it's life by routine, and may drive you to distraction by it's odd hours. These dogs are not fond of work, and prefer to "supervise".

## **No Five in the Chart**

Five is the second number on the spiritual level, positioned exactly in the centre of the chart. Basically, emotions will be intense and an emphasis will be placed on communal living.

No fives implies a level of inflexibility and these dogs can even fear change. In new places this dog may feel insecure and long to return to places where it feels at home. They may also lack curiosity about life and lack drive and motivation.

## **No Sixes in the Chart**

This number is positioned in the centre of the intellectual level and symbolizes an energy which can be used either constructively or destructively. It describes a creativity which comes about when the five senses are brought into harmony with the power of the spirit. It also signifies love of home and family environment.

This can often refer to a dog that has lacked a stable family background or who had problems or difficulties experienced during their early years. These dogs can also lack motivation and need constant direction.

## **2 Sevens in the Chart**

As the last number of the practical level, seven takes on a very special function in our lives. It shows how much sacrifice and self denial we are willing to put up with to improve ourselves.

The combination of two sevens creates an intensity which gives this dog great inner strength and the ability to overcome life's obstacles. Their path may have hurdles, but the effort won't be in vain. These are dogs with a high level of understanding and wisdom.

## **No Eight in the Chart**

Eight is the final number on the spiritual or emotional level. It can be seen as a double four containing practical and organizational abilities and the ability to see a task through to the end.

A dog with no 8 is unlikely to be a finisher, always losing interest quickly and moving on to something else. They can also lack self control, and do not like to do things alone, preferring to always be with the pack.

## **No Nine in the Chart**

Nine is the final number on the mental level and stands for idealism and determination. In mythology nine is associated with the war god, Mars which tells us why people have tried to realize their ideas and ambitions through acts of violence. It remains to be hoped that this behaviour won't dominate this century.

No nine in the chart suggests that this dog may be fearful of expressing emotions as they see it as a sign of weakness. These dogs can prefer to isolate themselves and their emotions.

## **The Line of Poor Memory (missing 3, 6 and 9)**

We only find this arrow in a numerological birthchart since we advanced into the year 2000. Only since then is it possible to have no numbers on the intellectual level of the birthchart (3,6 and 9).

As an owner of this animal, you should put a lot of effort into the training of their intellectual capacities, especially the ones which are involved with the daily routines and basic commands. These dogs should be kept mentally alert by stimulating their intellect (eg, by hiding treats in kong balls, or playing hide and seek with their treats in the yard).

### **The Line of Frustration (missing 4, 5 and 6)**

The line is determined by the absence of the numbers four, five and six, which together form the Line of the Will. That means that you should build up enough willpower to make yourself independent and to find your own way. It's about more than just asserting yourself, but about using your power of concentration to reach a specific goal.

This missing line often indicates family or home separations and strained relationships with one or both parents (or owners) at an early age. It can also denote a lack of will power and the propensity to give up too quickly when learning new tasks.

### **The Line of Procrastination (missing 1, 5 and 9)**

The presence of the Arrow of Procrastination effectively divides the Birthchart in two, separating the intuitive/analytical components from the practical. And that is exactly what procrastination does - it causes things to be delayed or not executed at all.

Caring owners should recognise this trait very early in their dog's life and teach it to develop patience and persistence to complete every little deed they attempt. Persistence and decisiveness need to be developed.

## The Ruling Number

This numerological analysis is done by adding the digits of your dog's birthday. All the digits are added until the sum consists of a single digit, with the exception of the numbers 11 and 22. These are referred to as the Master Numbers of Numerology and therefore are retained as double digits. This sum is called the Ruling Number. It indicates the challenge presented by our existence, a challenge which we will have to face, no matter what we do. The ruling number also points to an appropriate path which is in harmony with our dog's personality. This is the path we should choose for our dog.

### Life as a Two

*Keywords: Cooperative, Peaceful, Gentle, Reserved*

This number is, along with 22/4, one of the most rare because only one sum will result in the number 2, namely 20.

The qualities which make up the personality of a 2 are usually considered "feminine", because the number two is usually associated with the Moon. For that reason a 2 is sensitive, responsible, and often concerned about others (people and animals). This dog can even sometimes be an effective mediator between the opposing sides of a conflict if you have many animals in your household. Generally, they are less concerned with their own welfare than with others.

They are great with group activities and get along well with other animals.

A 2 dog can adapt to different situations well, require companionship and is basically a delicate and considerate companion. People are attracted to your dog's warmth and friendliness.

Some 2 dogs however, can appear aloof. This is due to their sensitive nature, and is only a defence they use to protect themselves.

When 2 dogs aren't feeling well, they can sink into self pity and make minor ailments seem quite severe. They do generally recover quickly though.

And 2 dogs hate to throw out old toys, bones, treasures and keepsakes, even when they are beyond repair!

## The Significance of Your Dog's Birthday

There are a few basic rules for the interpretation of birthdays which are easy to explain:

If the sum of the digits of your dog's birthday is 3, 6 or 9 then it is friendly and outgoing, can make a good impression on people and likes being around lots of people or other animals. Once this dog's interest has been aroused, it will become very active.

If the sum of the digits of your dog's birthday is 2, 4, 8, 11 or 22, things won't be so easy. This dog is more complicated and won't express feelings or emotions that easily. In extreme cases they may even avoid other people or animals or seem very aloof. However, these dogs tend to work hard and can be great assistants.

The remaining numbers, 1, 5, and 7 indicates a dog who learns well and can adapt to different situations quickly.

### Born on the 27th of the Month

Dogs born on the 27<sup>th</sup> are usually quiet, self-assured and determined. They are not good at obeying orders, however they are very affectionate and are willing to sacrifice their feelings and pleasures for others (so they may obey you after all just to please you!).

Dogs born this day bounce back quickly from any setbacks in life and are persistent in whatever they do. And they don't know when they are beaten! 27<sup>th</sup> dogs also usually like to have the last word in any argument (or scolding)!

## The Number of Fate

The number of your dog's fate is the sum of all the values assigned to the vowels in your dog's name and represents your dog's expectations of itself as well as its behaviour (how your dog sees itself). The quality of this number doesn't necessarily have to be noticeable on the outside, because others seldom have any clue as to how a dog (or even a person) sees themselves.

### If Your Number of Fate is Four

This dog will work conscientiously and do its best to earn your respect, but also to satisfy its own need for security. For this dog it is most important to get through the day and take care of its basic obligations (whatever those may be, such as taking you for a walk).

It also makes your dog happy when others rely on it and demonstrate their trust.

## **The Number of Appearance**

Your dog's number of appearance is calculated by adding the values assigned to the consonants in your dog's name and then adding the digits of the sum. As the term implies, this number stands for the way others see your dog and for the impression your dog leaves on people. The perception of others can be very different from our opinion of our dog.

### **If Your Number of Appearance is Six**

This dog will seem to be idealistic and are happy to work hard in order to help others. Other people may assume that your dog values harmony and loving togetherness over everything else.

## **The Name's Dominant Number**

This number is made up by adding the number of fate to the number of appearance. The sum reveals the strengths and weaknesses which are associated with your dog's name and therefore are noticeable from a very early age. Naturally we can all work with that which we have been given, as long as we are conscious of it.

### **The Name's Dominant Number One**

Dogs with a dominant number one can differ from each other, but have one thing in common: they will all lead very interesting and varied lives because they are open to new things and like to make their own experiences. If your dog is a one, it will always be prepared for life's surprises and can adapt to (nearly) any situation, depending on its attitude towards life: with a positive outlook, your dog will make a lot of people happy and will be popular; a negative outlook will provide your dog with problems no matter where you go.

Basically a 1 dog knows how to enjoy life and always tries to make itself as comfortable as possible. It sees life on Earth as an adventure, and would rather not know what will happen tomorrow. This lack of expectations and willingness to accept whatever comes makes them an important example for more fearful dogs.

A well adjusted 1 dog has the ability to concentrate on what it is doing without letting itself get distracted. In addition 1 dogs enjoy trying out new things and have a strong intellect and memory. Once a 1 dog has a goal in mind it can generate a lot of energy and always manage to keep itself motivated. They are also active dogs.

A negative 1 dog will tense up and act aggressively and embittered toward others. It may be very difficult for a negative 1 dog to form deep friendships and to learn to trust.
